Application and screening

[Understand the overview of the scholarships in Japan]

Read [A Guide to Scholarships] on page 4, and understand the types and average stipend, number of grantees, etc. Most of the scholarships are targeted for the undergraduate and graduate students at universities.

[Look for the scholarships which you are eligible for!]

Check the eligibility such as school level, age, nationality, etc. Look for those you are eligible for.

[Find out more in details]

Contact either “School” or “Foundation” according to the “Inquiry” column, and find out more in details and get an application form.

[Submit the application]

Fill out the application form and submit to the place according to “Application” column along with other required documents (eg. a curriculum vitae, a student registration certificate, a transcript, a recommendation from your teacher, a health certificate, photographs, a copy of your alien registration).

[Screening process]

Screening takes place in a variety of ways - on the basis of documents alone or written test (general education, knowledge on major, Japanese language ability, etc.), and interviews.

[Screening results]

Screening results will be notified to the applicants by the foundation or through their school.
