

# 2026 Examination for Japanese University Admission for International Students (1st Session) Cautions upon Taking the Exam (Attached Sheet)

Please pay particularly close attention to the following requirements.

Bring your original Residence card, passport, or My Number Card to confirm your identity.



Notes: If you forget your personal identification document or bring anything other than the original, you will not be able to take the exam. Please remove your face mask to help confirm your identity.

Take the exam with an "HB pencil."



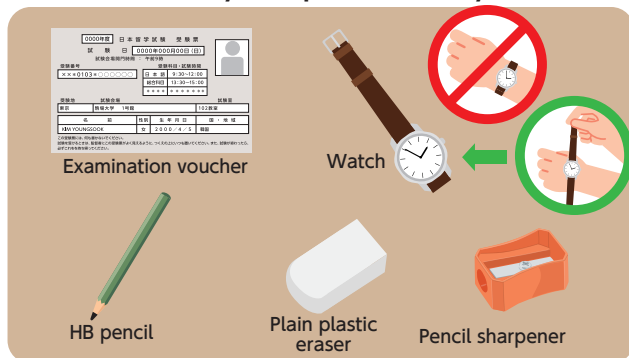

Note: Please remove pencil caps.

Items that may be placed on your desk.



Notes: Watches should not be worn on the wrist but placed on the desk. Please remove the eraser case.

No eating or drinking is permitted during the examination.



Trash or any other items must not be discarded at the examination site. Take all litter home with you (lunch boxes, plastic bottles, etc.).



Smoking is banned in and around the examination sites, at bus stops and other specified locations.



# Examples of Frequently Seen Prohibited Behavior

Noises from the ringing or vibrating of mobile phones or other electronic devices. Time signal sounds from digital watches or alarm sounds.



Note: Switch off these devices to avoid noises.

Wearing or holding a smartwatch or other electronic devices.



Putting a mobile phone or other electronic devices in a pocket.



Not putting electronic devices in your bag, leaving them on the desk or chair, or using/operating them.



Wearing earphones or headphones. Putting them around your neck.



Looking at crib sheets, reference books or notebooks.



Glancing at the answer sheet of the person sitting next to you. Looking around or speaking to other examinees.

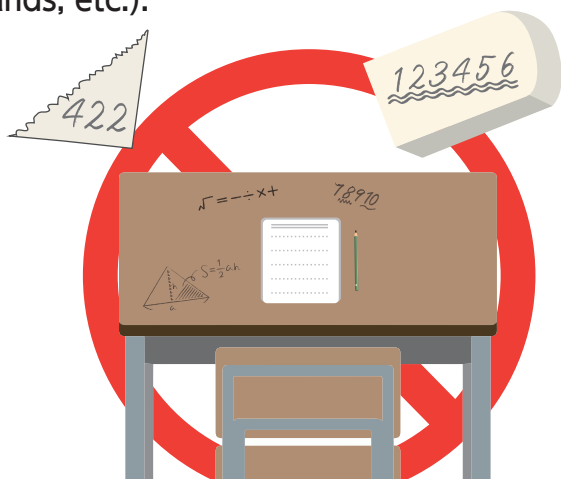


Attempting to take or actually taking question booklets or answer sheets out of the exam room or putting them in your bag.

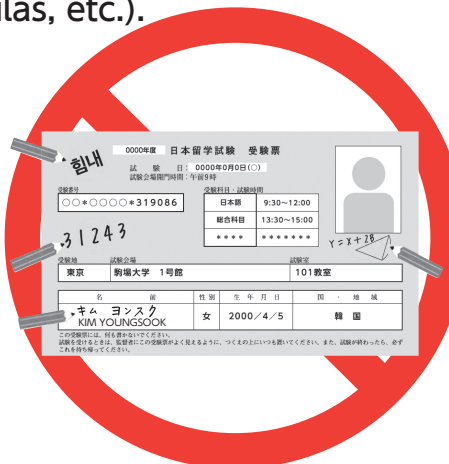


Note: Such acts are illegal.

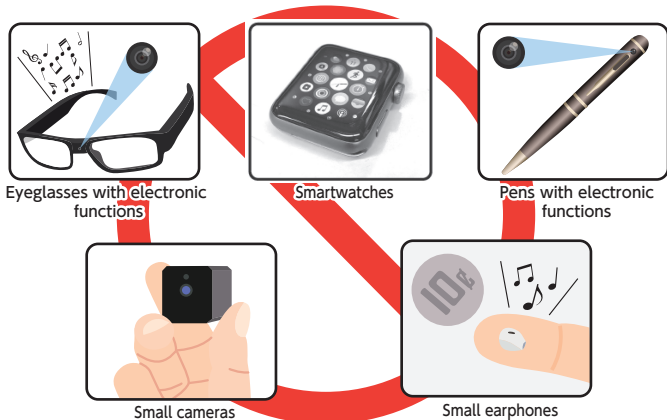
Copying examination questions or answers (on erasers, examination vouchers, desk, hands, etc.).



Writing on the examination voucher (i.e., kanji or furigana for name, notes, illustrations or other drawings, numbers, formulas, etc.).



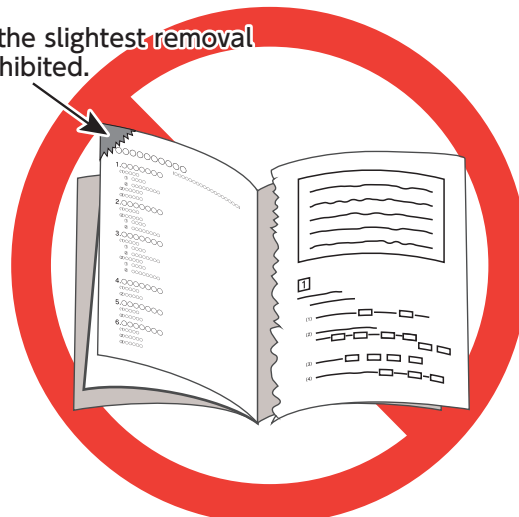
Using electronic devices to take photographs or make audio recordings of exam questions. Receiving test answers from other persons.



Note: Such acts are illegal.

Tearing off or removing portions of question booklets.

Even the slightest removal is prohibited.



# Examples of Frequently Seen Prohibited Behavior

Opening question booklets or writing down answers or the examination number, or your name before the exam staff says, "Please start answering."



Continuing to answer the questions after the exam staff says, "Please stop." "Not handing out the answer sheets immediately when collecting them."



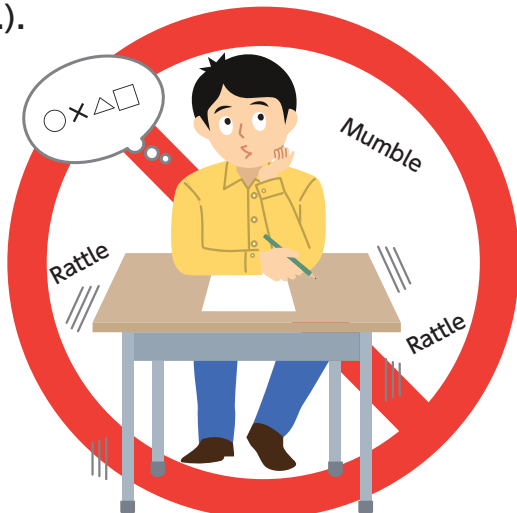
In the "Japanese as a Foreign Language" test, looking at the questions or answering on an answer sheet (mark-sheet) for the "Reading Comprehension" or other sections during designated time for "Writing" section.



Looking at and/or answering the actual questions in the "Listening-Reading Comprehension" or "Listening Comprehension" sections during the instructions or practice exercises of those sections in the "Japanese as a Foreign Language" test.



Actions that annoy other examinees (rattling a desk, mumbling to yourself, etc.).



Leaving the exam room without permission of the exam staff.



Note: During the "Listening-Reading Comprehension" and "Listening Comprehension" sections of the "Japanese as a Foreign Language" test (while audio portions are being played), even with permission for using the restroom or leaving the exam room due to feeling unwell, you will not be allowed to return until these sections have finished.
